I was raised in a working-class Baltimore City family by immigrant parents who came here for greater opportunities and I witnessed them struggle to overcome hardships. I am a native of the 41st District's Park Heights community.

I obtained my undergraduate bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from the University of Baltimore, followed by my Juris Doctor degree from the University of Maryland. I serve as an Assistant State's Attorney in Baltimore City with a focus on prosecuting illegal guns.

My hands-on experience makes me a more effective legislator who represents all of my constituents in Annapolis. In my first term, I have brought a fresh voice to Annapolis with uncompromising boldness and enthusiasm, and i am unafraid to stand up and fight for what Baltimore needs and deserves.

Providing a great education for our children is the most important issue in my district. We cannot neglect our children, and in order to create a strong future and reduce crime long-term, we need to ensure our children are being taken care of now- and that begins with education. As part of that relationship, Governor Hogan signed an executive order in 2017 prohibiting all executive branch agencies from entering into contracts or conducting official state business with any entity unless they certify that they will not engage in a boycott of Israel during the duration of the contract.
