

HOLIDAY CALENDAR 2025-2029

JUNE 2025

26, THURSDAY, – ISLAMIC HOLIDAY: AL HIJRA- Islamic New Year. Marks the migration of the Prophet Mohammad and his followers from Mecca to Medina of the Jewish people. (Fast begins 1st morning light)

JULY 2025

4 – FRIDAY, JULY FOURTH – Federal and state agencies closed.

AUGUST 2025

2, TISHA B'AV (SATURDAY EVENING) – Fast of the 9th of Av.

SEPTEMBER 2025

1, MONDAY – LABOR DAY – Federal and state agencies closed.

22-24 ROSH HASHANAH (MONDAY EVENING) TUESDAY and WEDNESDAY- (Jewish New Year) Begins the Jewish year 5784

25, THURSDAY – TZOM GEDALIAH: Commemorates the start of Babylonian exile.

OCTOBER 2025

1- 2, YOM KIPPUR (WEDNESDAY EVENING) THURSDAY (Day of Atonement)

Most holy of Jewish holidays, devoted to prayer, fasting and repentance.

13, MONDAY – COLUMBUS DAY – Federal and state agencies closed.

6 OCT - SUKKOT (MONDAY EVENING) ENDS WEDNESDAY OCT 8 (Feast of Tabernacles) - First day of festival of harvest, thanksgiving, and remembrance of the Jewish wandering in the wilderness and living in booths or tabernacles after the exodus from Egypt.

14 - SHEMINI ATZERET (WEDNESDAY EVENING) THURSDAY (Eighth Day of Assembly) - Marks the climax of the Jewish holy season.

15 - SIMCHAT TORAH (THURSDAY EVENING) FRIDAY (Rejoicing in the Law) - Reading of the Torah is completed and begun anew in the synagogue.

24, FRIDAY - UNITED NATIONS DAY

26, FRIDAY - REFORMATION DAY - Observed by Protestant groups to mark the beginning of Protestant Reformation in 1517.

NOVEMBER 2025

1, SATURDAY - ALL SAINTS DAY: Christian holy day of obligation commemorating all saints.

2, SUNDAY – ALL SOULS' DAY: Roman Catholic day of remembrance for friends and loved ones who have passed away.

11, TUESDAY – VETERANS DAY - Federal and state agencies closed.

17 - 21 - AMERICAN EDUCATION WEEK

27, THURSDAY - THANKSGIVING DAY: Federal and state agencies closed.

29, FRIDAY - AMERICAN INDIAN HERITAGE DAY

DECEMBER 2025

8, MONDAY - FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION – Catholic holy day celebrating the privilege of freedom from sin.

10, WEDNESDAY - HUMAN RIGHTS DAY - Marks U.N. adoption of the Universal

15, MONDAY - BILL OF RIGHTS DAY - Marks ratification of the first ten amendments to the U.S. Constitution in 1791.

14 – 22 CHANUKAH (SUNDAY EVENING) MONDAY (Festival of Lights) - Eight-day festival marking the first recorded battle for religious liberty and rededication of the Temple by the Maccabees.

25, THURSDAY, CHRISTMAS DAY – Federal and state agencies closed.

JANUARY 2026

1, THURSDAY- NEW YEAR'S DAY – Schools closed. Federal and state agencies closed

10, FRIDAY - ASARAH B'TEVET (Fast of Tevet-which begins morning light)

Commemorates the beginning of the Babylonian siege of Jerusalem (6th Century BCE). Declaration of Human Rights in 1948

19, MONDAY – MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. DAY – In honor of Martin Luther King, Jr. (b. 1929). Schools closed. Federal and state agencies closed.

FEBRUARY 2026

ALL FEBRUARY – AFRICAN AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH

2, MONDAY – TU BISHVAT – New Year for Trees

12, THURSDAY – LINCOLN'S BIRTHDAY (b. February 12, 1809).

16, MONDAY – PRESIDENTS' DAY – Celebrates the birthdays of George Washington (b. 1732) and Abraham Lincoln (b. 1809). Schools closed. Federal and state agencies closed.

18, WEDNESDAY – ASH WEDNESDAY- Opens Lenten Season

MARCH 2026

2, MONDAY – TA'ANIT ESTHER (Fast of Esther) – Commemorates the fast of Queen Esther (Fast begins Thursday morning).

2-3 PURIM (MONDAY EVENING) TUESDAY- Jewish day of merry making, marking defeat of Persian tyrant, Haman

17, TUESDAY – ST. PATRICK'S DAY

25, WEDNESDAY- MARYLAND DAY – Commemorating the arrival of Lord Baltimore's first settlers in Maryland in 1634.

29, SUNDAY – PALM SUNDAY

APRIL 2026

1 – 3 PESACH (WEDNESDAY EVENING) THURSDAY & FRIDAY- First two days of PESACH (Passover) Jewish festival marking deliverance from slavery in Egypt.

3, FRIDAY – GOOD FRIDAY

4, SATURDAY - HOLY SATURDAY

5, SUNDAY – EASTER

8 - 9 – PESACH (WEDNESDAY EVENING) THURSDAY- Concluding days of PESACH (Passover).

12, SUNDAY - EASTERN ORTHODOX EASTER

13 - 14, YOM HASHOAH (MONDAY EVENING) TUESDAY: Holocaust Remembrance Day – Memorializing the six million martyrs who died in the Holocaust, 1939-1945.

USE OF HOLIDAY CALENDAR

This calendar was prepared and designed mainly to help teachers and school administrators plan and schedule special events and activities such as examinations, assemblies, field trips, graduations and other school-related programs. Federal, state, county, and city government agencies, legislative bodies, and courts, as well as private employers, may also find this calendar helpful. ALL Jewish holidays are set according to the Hebrew lunar calendar, so that they begin at sundown on the preceding evening and

conclude at sundown on the dates noted. The Sabbath begins at sunset on Friday evening and concludes at sunset on Saturday. During these observances, work is traditionally prohibited. As a result, Jewish individuals may be absent from both school and places of employment.

No person should be penalized for his/her religious observances or beliefs.
